Civic and Character Education

1. Classroom input towards rules and goals of respectful behavior
2. Weekly Behavior Awards during our Monday morning announcements: Honoring significant improvements and exemplary behavior.
3. Self-Management Systems of support via student interventions
4. Anti-Drugs Assemblies followed up with classroom discussions
5. Red Ribbon Week (anti-drug focus)
6. Anti-Bullying Assemblies followed up with classroom discussions
7. Pledge of allegiance as a school every Monday morning
8. Pledge of allegiance as individual classrooms Tuesday through Friday
9. School participation in Veteran's Day local cemetery ceremony.
10. Daily, on-going instruction embedded during the day as need and opportunities to reinforce arise. (honesty, integrity, morality, civility, duty, honor, service, and obedience to law)
11. Music instruction includes patriotic songs
12. This is the Place assembly honoring Utah history (4th Grade)
13. Utah history curriculum (4th Grade)
14. US history curriculum
15. Pride in your school by wearing a school t-shirt on Fridays (a sense of belonging and to foster duty to our school and community)
16. A newsletter promoting activities, accomplishments, etc. goes out quarterly to partner with family, home, and parents. This fosters respect and a sense of unity essential in supporting our civic and character education.
17. School Staff promotes civic and character education by living examples of school expectations.
18. Respect, Responsibility, and Excellence Always is posted throughout the school building and reinforced daily.
19. Classroom Rules and expectations are posted.
